It will be a 9-hole scramble, with prizes for closest to the pin, longest drive and low score for your foursome. Currently have reserved tee times for up to 4 groups from 3:16 until 3:40, but will add a 5th or 6th group if needed, so please let me know by Sun Sept 20. Golfers will each tee off, and then each will play next shot from the best shot (fairly quickly please). Each group will need to use at least one tee shot from each member of the foursome at some point in the 9 holes. If you do not have a foursome and are looking to play, please let us know and we will try to form another group...but try to form your own group if possible.

Pump-out Service available for non-sewer sites on Wed & Sun (\$20—please sign up 1 day in advance).

Please note that the state of CT has determined that the portable sewage disposal devices ("blue boys") are not permitted for use Waterslide—Sorry, slide closed due to low water level in the pond.

A reminder that our rates include 2 adults and up to 4 children. Any visitors who are not part of your registered party must pay the day visitor fee of \$8/adult and \$5/child or senior citizen (no charge age 3 and under), or the overnight fee of \$12/adult or \$8/child/senior.

Parents please note--You are responsible for the behavior of your children. Please make your children aware of our rules (such as helmets for bike riders under age 16, no cutting through campsites) and curfews, and help us enforce them. All our campers appreciate your cooperation

Although a fishing license is needed if venturing out of the campground, you don't need one for our stocked pond...catch & release please! Trout (over 100 stocked this year), bass, bullheads & more.

\*\*Trash--Please bring your trash and recyclables to receptacles located near the dump station at entrance/exit. Only recyclables in the single stream recyclable dumpster (far right), and no "bulky waste" please. A reminder that while there are 4 restroom buildings, coin-operated showers are located in the restrooms near site 43 and near site 74.

Don't forget to take a moment and read the campground rules on the back of the map, noting such items as quiet hours and bike rules (helmets for those under 16 and no bike riding after dark please), as well as speed limits within the campground and through the neighborhood.

**WiFi:** Each site receives 1 free ticket for one device for the duration of your stay, while one free hour for any other device is provided each day. Additional tickets for any extra devices are available for just \$1 per day, \$5 per week or \$10 per month by purchasing access code tickets in the office, or purchasing on-line via Paypal at the "sunfox wifi" login page. Please note that the materials used in construction of some RVs (steel, aluminum, fiberglass) may inhibit signal strength, and best reception will be achieved at your picnic table outside your RV. There are numerous "Hot Spot" antennas located throughout the campground, but reception may vary based on your computer's wi-fi antenna, the weather or other factors that impact wireless signals. Our wi-fi network is intended to allow campers to check their email and browse the web. It is not able to provide for downloading movies or large files, nor should it be considered an alternative to a secure, wired connection that may be needed for some business applications.

Our 48-channel satellite TV system is activated for the season. See our website for a channel list, or pick one up in the office, and be sure to select "cable" input and perform a channel scan.

We are about to begin contacting campers on our seasonal waiting list, as there are just a couple of sites opening up for 2021, so if there are any <u>current</u> seasonals interested in relocating, it looks like the following sites may be open: 10, 31A, 36, and 59.

Be sure to check out our new trails and paths! A map is available on our website. Feel free to add to our "Fairy Path" along Blissville Brook with items made from nature (or perhaps painted rocks), and please don't disturb what others have built. Campers are also welcome to borrow a ball to play on our new 4-square courts or in the GaGa Ball pit.

We appreciate everyone's cooperation and effort in helping to keep themselves and their fellow campers safe. The latest guidance from CDC indicates that masks, social distancing and hand-washing work very well, as the transmission is down and is almost exclusively person to person, particularly indoors. The risk of transmission through other surface contact and objects appears to be minimal, and is reduced even more by frequent hand washing. Please be sure to wear your mask when social distancing becomes difficult, or when interacting with staff & campers. We are also able to resume some sports activities, such as kickball and dodgeball, but a few events, such as Tug of War, Greased Pole and Karaoke, are still on hold. We recently constructed a large 80x40 tent on the other side of the pond for Bingo and other events (especially if the weather does not permit a poolside dance).

This weekend is the final weekend for our swimming pool and hot tub, and with overnight lows around 40, the pool heater can only do so much. Our goal is 72 degrees, but that may be tough. Our new event tent on the hill will host our first ever dance concert on Saturday night with "Branded". On Sunday afternoon, we will continue our tradition of allowing kids in the hot (warm) tub, as the temp is reduced on closing day. Due to social distancing, kids will be limited to small family groups for a short time, taking turns. Any adults looking to use the hot tub on Sunday should plan to do so during Candy Bingo or prior, as kids will be welcomed from 12:45PM until 2:30PM.
